What You Can Do To "Keep Marshall Flying at Cambridge Airport" !

Cllr Robert Dryden writes:

Former Mayor of Cambridge, Councillor Robert Dryden has asked for help from Teversham people to "Keep Marshall flying at Cambridge Airport", instead of bowing to council pressure to move Marshall Aerospace and the airport to Wyton, or even further from Cambridge. This will build on the excellent earlier RAVE campaign and has support from all neighbouring villages and communities.

As their recent centenary showed, Marshall is vital for Cambridge, including the 1700 employees and their families. We need these jobs not the environmental damage of a massive unsustainable new town of 12000 more houses and 12,000 more cars.

How you can help ?

1 - Join the planned 'Ramble Around Cambridge Airport' on Sunday 15th November with your friends or family , a fun and healthy way to show your support - 4.5 miles around the Marshall airport perimeter, starting from Newmarket Road Park and Ride at 12.30pm

2 - Offer to help on the day by being a 'Marshall Marshall' or assist at the half way refreshment stop

3 - Sign the campaign petition, or even better collect petition signatures yourself to persuade our councils that Marshalls must stay where they are now

Following the summer break, the Parish Council have been busy working to improve our village.

We would like to thank the Tamarind for their donation towards the planting of daffodil bulbs on the verge at the junction of High Street/Church Road. Further bulbs have been planted at the pinch point on Cherry Hinton Road.

Work continues to improve the villages five play areas with a new bench being installed at Lady Jermy Way. A new double headed lamp will also be installed by the time this newsletter reaches you to illuminate the play area during the darker nights.

Do you enjoy gardening? Would you be willing to spare some time to help clear the brick planters at High Street and Cherry Hinton Road? If you are, please contact the Clerk. We are hoping to plant some winter colour and build in some regular maintenance so these become a pleasing assets to our village all year round.

The Parish Council have also been working gaining a grant to clean the war memorial and work continues to maintain and repair play equipment. Finally, we would like to thank Borley Brothers for once again assisting us. 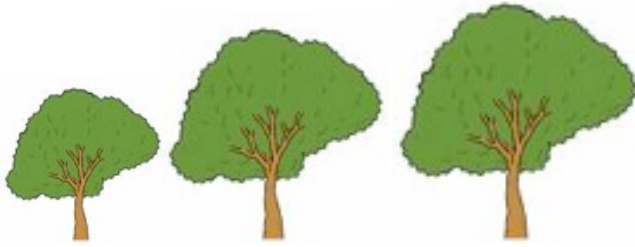
CHRISTMAS LIGHTS COME TO TEVERSHAM

TREES MATTER!

Cambs District Council has re-launched its Tree Warden scheme, aiming to have a volunteer "Tree Champion" in each Parish.

Parish Councillor Dave Kelleway is the Tree warden for Teversham, and he writes, asking for your help:

I am not an expert, just someone who recognises how trees enrich our lives in so many ways, and how important it is for all of us to look after, protect and increase the number of our trees.

For many years Teversham Parish council has planted trees all over our parish, recognising their importance in terms of the environment, wildlife, and simply to make Teversham a nicer place to live.

Trees saved

A good local example of community action to protect trees was when the district council were threatening to demolish the council homes in Spurgeon and Pembroke Close a couple of years ago.

Through local knowledge, we were able to get a Tree Preservation order (TPO) on two large trees that

were at risk from the plans to build a much denser development.

Your help needed

I need help from as many residents as possible, to be the eyes and ears of the community, so that we get early warning of tree problems such as disease, gale damage or vandalism, and of trees that may be under threat from development – please contact me if you have concerns about any of the above issues.

To protect and value Teversham's trees, we need to know more about them, and where they are. You can help by giving your views on the following questions:

- Which is your favourite tree in Teversham?
- Where is the biggest tree in Teversham?
- Which is the oldest tree in Teversham?
- Do you know of any rare or unusual trees in Teversham?
- Where do you think we could plant a new tree?
- What kind of trees would you like to see more of?
- Would you be prepared to water a newly planted tree?

I look forward to your responses, which will help to improve our knowledge of Teversham's tree population.
