Wheelie Good? Blue bins are hitting the streets of South Cambridgeshire

Households across South Cambridgeshire will be taking delivery of their new blue bin between 31 August and 6 October. The blue bin will replace the green box scheme and be an easier and cheaper way of collecting dry recyclables. Collections will take effect from Monday 11 October.

On delivery, residents are asked to be aware that the blue bin lids may not close properly due to the way in which they were stacked for storage. The lid should settle after a week or so.

The majority of residents will not experience a change to their collection day. There may, however, be a small change to the time of some collections so residents are reminded to ensure their bins are out by 7am on their designated day of collection.

Parish Plan

The Parish Council are in the very early stages of considering if our community would benefit from a parish plan. A Parish Plan is a document setting out how we, the residents, want to see the area develop over the next few years. It can cover a range of issues, and gives us a recognised voice. Communities of any size can produce a Parish Plan.

The Parish Plan documents the socio-economic and environmental issues of our community and its proposed remedies and actions.

Parish plans are evolving documents, outlining how a community would like to develop over the next 10 years. It will include a vision for the future, an expression of the residents' views and an action plan detailing how these developments can be achieved. It will outline how the parishioners, the Parish Council, Government (at all levels) and local service providers can act to deliver the plan addressing the residents' wishes. Well researched and structured parish plans are effective at engaging their mainstream providers (local authorities) than those focused purely on a local audience

For the plan to be effective, it needs **YOUR** input! It needs to be able to demonstrate that all of the villagers have had a chance to give their input, and that the key conclusions are those of the whole village. This is a task that should be undertaken by members of the whole community, not just the Parish Council. Do you have a little spare time to give? Are you **COMMUNITY SPIRITED?** Have you some **TIME TO SPARE?** Are you **OPEN MINDED, OBJECTIVE AND IMPARTIAL?** Are you **DISCREET?** If you can answer yes to these questions, would you like to become an Independent Custody Visitor?

Cambridgeshire Police Authority is looking for people to join its Custody Visitor Panels. The Panels are independent of the police and their role is to make unannounced visits to police stations in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough to observe and report to the Police Authority about the conditions under which people detained to assist police with their enquiries are being held. The work of the visitors is vital in order to ensure that detainees' rights are being respected and that they are being treated properly.

Independent Custody Visitors are unpaid, but allowances are payable to cover expenses incurred. The time commitment required of Visitors is not onerous (3 to 4 hours a month) and training will be given to successful applicants.

Applications are invited from any person, aged 18 years or over and residing in Cambridgeshire, Peterborough or Fenland. To ensure the credibility of the Custody Visiting Scheme, persons with connections with the Criminal Justice System (e.g. police, courts, prisons service, etc.) cannot be considered. **INTERESTED?** Then please get in touch with us. The Cambridge Branch of Hearing Dogs for Deaf People is organising a sponsored stroll in Milton Country Park on Sunday 10 October from 10.00 am until approximately 3.00 pm. We would like to encourage people from Cambridge and the surrounding villages to come along with their dogs and families and enjoy a walk whilst raising much-needed funds for this very worthwhile cause. We will present medals to those who complete the course and there will be a treat for dogs at the finish point. On the day there will be a giant tombola, Hearing Dogs merchandise, puppies in training, working partnerships and much more. There is an excellent café where, after your walk, you can sit back and enjoy some refreshments or alternatively stock up at the café before you start so that you can enjoy a picnic en route. There are plenty of seats along the way so that you can stop and enjoy the scenery and all that the park has to offer. The routes will meander along paths beside the lakes where, at the time of writing, there are swans, cygnets, ducks and ducklings to be seen. Despite the proximity to the A14 there is a very tranquil atmosphere and the site is very child and dog friendly. The routes of 2 miles and approximately 5 miles will be well marked and maps will be available. The majority of the route is very wheelchair and pushchair friendly and is generally flat. Dogs and accompanied children will be very welcome. Cost per participant is just £2.00 but we hope that many walkers will obtain sponsorship to increase the amount raised for the charity.
