Firstly thank you to those that have reported anti-social behaviour in your village, we will be following these up with visit's to the offenders home address in front of their parents and issuing a section 59 warning.

Section 59 is a warning that can be issued on the vehicle and driver if it is being used OR has been used in a manner which causes alarm, distress or annoyance to members of the public.

After a warning has been served it remains on record for 12 months, if the vehicle is used again in a similar manner then the Police have the power to seize the vehicle. This would mean the owner incurring recovery charges and storage charges for everyday it remains unclaimed.

If you believe that a vehicle is being used in an Anti Social Manner please try and get down as much information as you can remember, particularly registration numbers, a description of the car and driver. If we can obtain a statement it may be possible to obtain a warning notice.

The reports of parking outside the school on the Airport Way side of the zebra crossing is increasing please may we remind everyone that parking in such a manner can be dangerous to all, especially to those of you that have children attending Teversham Primary school at the beginning of the school day and at the end. We Do Not have to give words of warning with regards to obstructive/dangerous parking, so please take this on board, as we are working with the Parish Council and Highways to remedy the situation. There is parking available at the conservative club and possibly at the Indian restaurant on the high street, as it appears that some parents are parking where they want to without regards to other road users or children's safety.

The summer is upon us and with schools breaking up please note that burglary's tend to increase and also theft of purses/ wallets and any personal belongings left unattended in or out of vehicles. Just a reminder, during spells of hot weather remember to close windows to avoid unwanted visitors, and to be mindful of leaving doors ajar. Also Barbecues seem to attract those that don't see the dry grass/ fields as a problem when having garden/ street parties, please be safe when lighting these and have some water / sand close by...

Medieval Life and Times

Once again the Abbey returns to the dark days of the 12th century and feudal anarchy reigns...

Come and join in with Medieval life at The Farmland Museum and Denny Abbey with the Medieval living history group "The Feudal Archers" at this special Bank Holiday weekend event

The Farmland Museum and Denny Abbey are holding an exciting **Medieval** event on Sunday 28th and Monday 29th August 2011, 10.30am-5pm, starring the Medieval living history group the Feudal Archers, who will be providing special hands on and interactive based activities related to the life of people who would have lived at Denny Abbey from 1159.

Visitors will be able to experience an authentic **Medieval campsite** complete with kitchen and living quarters, as well as being able to watch the many **skilful archers** who shoot the 'longbow', famous for many centuries as an English weapon of war. There will also be a **traditional bowyer** demonstrating the skill of making bows and arrows the medieval way. **Craftsmen** will also be making their wares and the cooks will prepare a meal for the group. Meanwhile, the ladies will demonstrate **spinning and weaving techniques**. The fighting men of the group will give informal talks about a large range of **12th Century armour and weapons**.

Our local brewer will also be on site with **real ale and cider** for sale and **our resident basket maker** will be demonstrating her intricate willow work. Children will be able to get more involved in the medieval theme by making their own **shields**.

On Monday 29th August a new permanent display "The Farriers Workshop" will be opened at 12pm by a special guest.

The Farmland Museum & Denny Abbey is open every day from 1st April - 31st October, weekdays 12-5pm, weekends and bank holidays 10.30am-5pm. It is situated on the A10 between Cambridge and Ely. Admission prices for the event are Adults £5.50, Concessions £4.50, Children £3.50 (under 5s are free), Family Ticket £16 with reduced admission to the Farmland Museum for English Heritage members.
