Superfast broadband is coming to Teversham soon

Connecting Cambridgeshire is rolling out superfast broadband to over 90,000 premises across Cambridgeshire and Peterborough, which would not get it otherwise.

New green cabinets in this area are going live with fibre broadband between September and December 2014 which means many homes and businesses will soon be able upgrade to faster Internet services.

You can find out about when your postcode area is expected to be connected and if your nearest fibre cabinet has gone live by visiting the 'my area' pages on the Connecting Cambridgeshire website at www.connectingcambridgeshire.co.uk

Click on the 'my area' button on the home page and select your parish or area from the A-Z list. Each page has links to the coverage map showing the status of new fibre cabinets serving each postcode area and useful information about how to get superfast broadband.

Meanwhile, look out for Openreach engineers installing new green cabinets in your area. Connecting Cambridgeshire 'Fibre broadband is here' stickers will be applied when they go live.

Need help using the Internet? Your local library can link you up with someone to show you how, or call Cambridge Direct Contact Centre on 0345 045 5200 to find your nearest access point.

This is why the High Street is being dug up - new cables are being put down in preparation - *ed*

District Councillor's report September 2014

Update on changes to Waste and Recycling Services

Over the next five years the council has to save £4m due to a reduction in government funding. This equates to a quarter of its annual budget. Some savings have already been found but there is still £1.1m which needs to be found before April 2015. Changes to the Waste and Recycling Service will contribute about £400,000 to these savings.

- 1) From this month the collection rounds have been changed to make them more efficient. Apart from 9 properties everyone's collection day will remain the same but the council is asking residents to put their bins out before 6am on collection day. These changes were published in the summer and autumn editions of the SC magazine.
- 2) In December, January and February collection of the green bins will take place on a monthly basis. These are the months that far less green waste is put out.
- 3) Over the Christmas period collections will be as normal until 27th December and then there will be a break until 5th January when collections will return to their normal timetable.

Housing

Successes for 2013/14, include:

- 1) 158 new affordable homes have been built.
- 2) 10 empty homes have been purchased to be used as temporary accommodation.
- 3) There has been a 75% reduction in the use of B & Bs as temporary accommodation – the bill has gone down from £8,000 per month in the last financial year to £2,000 per month.
- 4) Over 1,000 solar panel installations have been made.
- 5) A 'Help to Downsize' scheme is now operating for tenants affected by benefit reform changes and has resulted in 28 downsize moves completed. The number of SCDC tenants under-occupying and effected by welfare reform changes continues to reduce and in September 2013 dropped to below 300, representing around a 20% reduction since the beginning of the year.
- 6) Two apprentices have been taken on in the housing service providing employment and a recognised qualification.

August Flooding

During the flooding in August SCDC delivered over 700 sandbags to residents. The council is urging residents to assess their homes for flood risk, mitigate against flooding as much as possible and to have their own personal 'flooding action plan' in place.



Following a very quiet holiday period everything is back up and running again. The first Sunday in September saw us finally make the move to Teversham CE Primary School and on a beautiful sunny day we were grateful for the extra space for children to meet in groups during the service and to enjoy space outside afterwards. We have a real range of ages on a Sunday now from the very young to more senior end of the community so we believe whatever your age or stage you'll find a welcome with us.

We've been really pleased to see the growth in numbers at **Classic Café** (for over 60s) which runs every other Friday afternoon at the Chapel. We're looking forward to welcoming Age UK once more on the 10th October for a 'Cambridgeshire Celebrates Age' event (you'll find more details elsewhere in Teversham News of this) and we've just had a **Harvest 'Songs of Praise'** style event. Around the time of the **D-Day** commemorations earlier this year we had a great afternoon with a veteran of the invasion of Italy in 1943 who shared lots of fascinating anecdotes about his experience of WWII and how he became a Christian in the bowels of a troop ship! Following Jesus Christ has taken him to several other parts of the world over the succeeding decades and he never regretted the decision he made. He's now a sprightly 92 and made a brief appearance on the BBC's Great British Menu this year. This November we'll be meeting with others from the Parish Church and the village to on **Remembrance Sunday** at the War memorial and hope others will share in this for such a poignant year.

We are starting the new academic year with great excitement and enthusiasm! We had a wonderful end to the year in July, with very good end of Key Stage Two SATs results showing very good progress for our Year 6 pupils who did us proud, especially in Maths and Reading, with the best results for several years. We are also very proud of the success of the children in Early Years. Our percentage of children who have achieved the Good Level of Development this year was up from last year, and well above national, and our Key Stage 1 children also performed exceptionally well. We are delighted that achievement and progress



throughout the school is very good and this reflects the skill and hard work of the children, the teachers and the teaching assistants. We were also thrilled this week to receive a letter of congratulations from the Local Authority on our excellent results and the hard work of the children, staff and governors.

We are passionate about our children achieving the very best but we also believe that school is about much more than results. Our Year 6s enjoyed some exciting end of term events, including our new Graduation Ceremony, where they were presented with their Bibles and special new Teversham School Hoodies. Their Leavers' Party which included a disco, a barbeque and water fight on our back field, was thoroughly enjoyed by all and was a fantastic way to mark the end of their time with us.

Other successful events last year included our Key Stage 2 performance of Shakespeare Rocks! The year 6s were an especially talented group of singers and the singing was exceptional this year.

Teversham School Pride Day

Our first ever School Pride Day Assembly took place in July, where we thought about all that we have achieved and enjoyed over the year. Videos

were played of each child in the school saying what they were individually proud of. The children also sang the song, "What have you done today to make you feel proud?" by Heather Small, and we have asked the children to think about this question at the end of each day as they go forward this year.

Outdoor Learning Area

We are thrilled that, following lots of different fund raising events, a generous donation from Marshall of Cambridge and funding from the National Lottery, we are now able to go ahead with the construction of our Outdoor Learning Area (see picture left). There will be an opening ceremony in October - so please look out for news of this event. We would love to invite members of the community to join us to celebrate this new addition to our facilities.



Our Assistant Headteacher, Mrs Coulson, moved on to pastures new at the end of last year, taking on the headship of Barton Primary School. We were thrilled for her but will miss her exceptional drive, energy and enthusiasm. We are delighted that Miss Godfrey has stepped up as our new Assistant Headteacher and we also welcome two new teachers, Miss Savill and Mr Dennis, to our community.

We are committed to building on our successes and fulfilling our mission statement of "Inspire, Believe, Achieve". We introduced our new logo in the Spring term (see above) which includes the traditional lapwing symbol of the school along with a small image of a plane to represent our links with The Marshall Group and a small cross to represent our church school status. The gold colour band represents our commitment to excellence.
