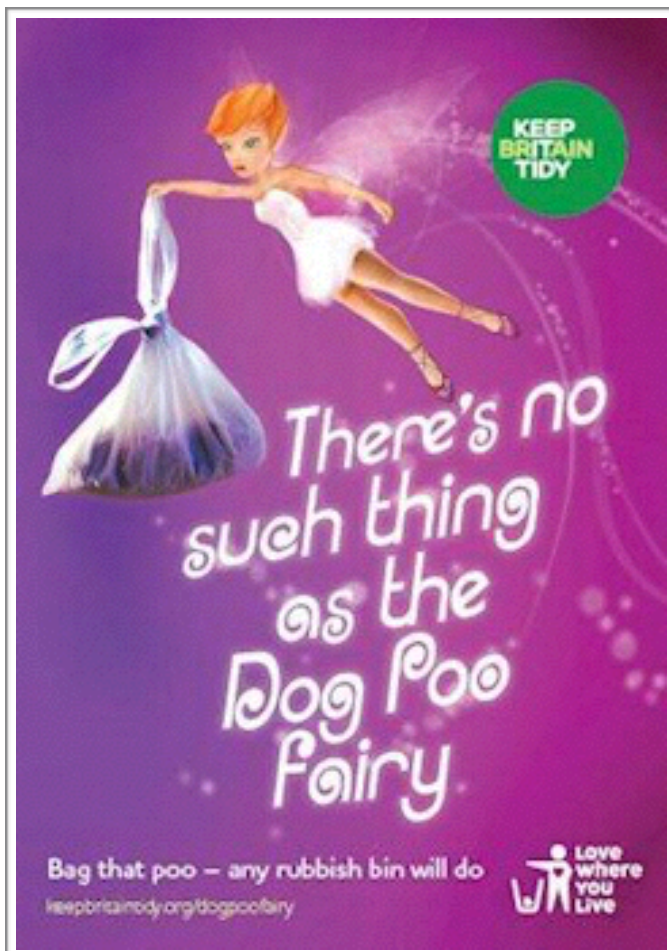

### District Council Report

#### Electoral Review

The Local Government Boundary Commission for England has given notice that it will be undertaking a Council electoral review which will formally commence in November 2015. The last review was over ten years ago and some areas of the district have grown faster than others since then, creating an imbalance in the number of residents represented by Councillors.

The Council has decided to recommend to the Commission that all District Council seats should be contested at the same time every four years, starting with all out elections in 2018. It was noted that potentially all parish council seats could also be elected at the same time which would save the parish council's expense and may also attract a larger turnout.

There is also to be a review of the number of District Councillors. At the moment there are 57 Councillors and the council decided to recommend a reduction to 45 (20% fewer) which would equate to three District Councillors for one County Councillor. Any change of ward boundaries will be reviewed by the Commission.

#### Investors in People

A few years ago SCDC achieved silver in the Investors in People scheme. In July the Council achieved the Gold award and became one of the top 7% of accredited organisations in the UK.

#### Local Plan Update

SCDC received a response from the inspectors at the end of July in which they recognised that the Council is taking a positive response to addressing the concerns which were raised and they have agreed to suspend all examinations until March 2016.

### Borley Way Skate Park

We would like to thank the three young users and three resident representatives who came along to a meeting in September. This gave everyone in attendance the opportunity to have their say and listen to the noise mitigation measures being worked on by the parish council. Having read the report received following a professional acoustic assessment, it was agreed to proceed with the installation of 1.8mtr fencing along the bund, wrapping around each end of the skate park and filling the centre ramp with foam. We hope that this expenditure will be endorsed at our next full council meeting.

The parish council was encouraged that anti-social behaviour has decreased significantly and continues work with residents, users of the park and the police to ensure that the park is managed correctly.

## Cambridgeshire seeks your views on next year's budget challenge

Latest predictions show Cambridgeshire County Council will have to find £41 million in savings next year alone and more than £100 million in savings over the next five years. This is at a time of massive growing demands on Council services.

With funding already reduced the Council is already making hard choices, such as looking at turning off street lights. The Council has already saved around £100 million in the last three years while trying to maintain vital frontline services, including caring for some of our most vulnerable.

Next year will have £15 million or 27 per cent less from the Government Revenue Support Grant while needing to find an extra £19.7 million to meet the pressures from more people needing our services as well as inflation. This is on top of other charges and savings we have to find – making up the £41 million total.

The challenge affects all of Cambridgeshire communities and the Council has launched a consultation to explain the problem and to show how we can work together to find solutions.

A film outlining what the Council does and how it is funded as well as areas where communities can help has been released as part of the consultation.

The film also shows just some ways people can help save nearly £2 million by recycling more, fostering, using online services or just simply helping a relative or neighbour.
