From Round the Table

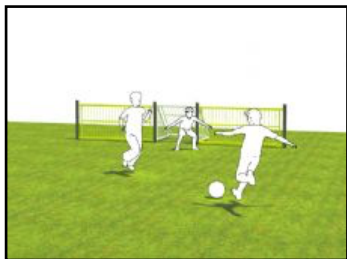

Skate Park

The new fencing has been installed. Unfortunately, as the ground is currently too soft, work to fill the centre ramp with specialist foam has had to be delayed. This will happen as soon as the ground is firm enough to support the contractors specialist equipment.

The new roundabout, trampoline and metal goal ends will be installed very soon and we welcome ideas for any additional facilities residents feel would be beneficial for the future.



Verges and Hedges

We're looking for volunteers in your area to join our successful Community Champion scheme.

Community Champions encourage local residents to carry out fire safety checks in their homes, visit community groups and educate about fire safety and escape plans.

We will train you, give you a uniform and provide you with a wide range of activities to choose from, all of which will help to keep our communities safe from the risk of fire.

Council Tax

Council rate, for the District Council proportion, was set in February by full Council. There will be an increase of £5 pa or 10p pw on a band D property – a rise from £125.31 per year to £130.32pa, with SCDC remaining one of the lowest rates in the country.

Ermine Street Housing

The Council's own estate agency is expecting to generate £600,000 of income in the next 2 years with higher returns possible in future years. All of this will be invested back into the Council in place of income previously received from the government and used to finance local services.

Electoral boundaries review

The Liberal Democrat group have come up with a different idea for Teversham Ward, one which I am supporting. I have always been against Teversham village being taken into the Fulbourn ward as I believe that Fulbourn would take over the ward. I believe we would be better served by going in with similar small villages and in fact, as some of you will remember, until reorganisation in 2004 Teversham was already warded with Fen Ditton and Horningsea. This proposal has that with the addition of Stow-Cum-Quy. I also think it is better for Teversham Foxgloves and Teversham Beechwoods to be represented together – something which residents on Beechwoods have been requesting for for sometime.

ed - the parish council are opposed to this proposal as it means splitting the parish between two different district wards - what do you think??

Local Plan

A key report published on Friday 4th March outlines the results of a public consultation on the proposed modifications to the Cambridge and South Cambridgeshire Local Plans. Careful consideration has been given to the wide range of over 1,000 comments received. The report recommends that proposed modifications and evidence put forward for consultation are now submitted to Government so the inspectors can recommence their examination.

The reports were considered at full Council meetings at both South Cambridgeshire District and Cambridge City Councils on Wednesday 23rd March and submitted to the inspectors at the end of March. Further details can be found by visiting the SCDC website.

SCDC Grant for warden scheme – This has been reduced slightly this year due to greater increases in demand from other schemes in the District.

Joint Director of Planning and Economic Development

A joint Director of Planning and Economic development has been appointed. He is Stephen Kelly and will work for SCDC and the City Council. This is part of the partnership savings scheme.

Community Chest Fund

A new year of Community chest funding has just commenced with a budget of £56,000. This will enable up to £1,500 to be given to local projects which benefit residents. Up to three grants per parish per year will be permitted.

A great Good Friday

With April showers coming a few days early, the inconsistent weather made it hard to predict what would greet us on Good Friday but we were blessed with a wonderful day for two events that both benefit from a bit of sunshine.

Over the last few years, a number of us from Hope have joined with Christians in Cherry Hinton for a 'Walk of Witness' down the High Street remembering the events of the first 'Good Friday'. Although there is an air of seriousness and solemnity about the occasion, there is also a lasting joy in the hearts of those who follow Jesus because we know that this event - at a real time and place in history - changed the world forever. The death of Jesus Christ was not a waste of great potential but a measure of what God's love was willing to do to deal with our wrongdoing and set us free to live for Him. It is great to do this with other local Christians of different backgrounds and cultures as a tiny demonstration of the way these events have changed the lives of countless millions across the world through the last 2000 years.

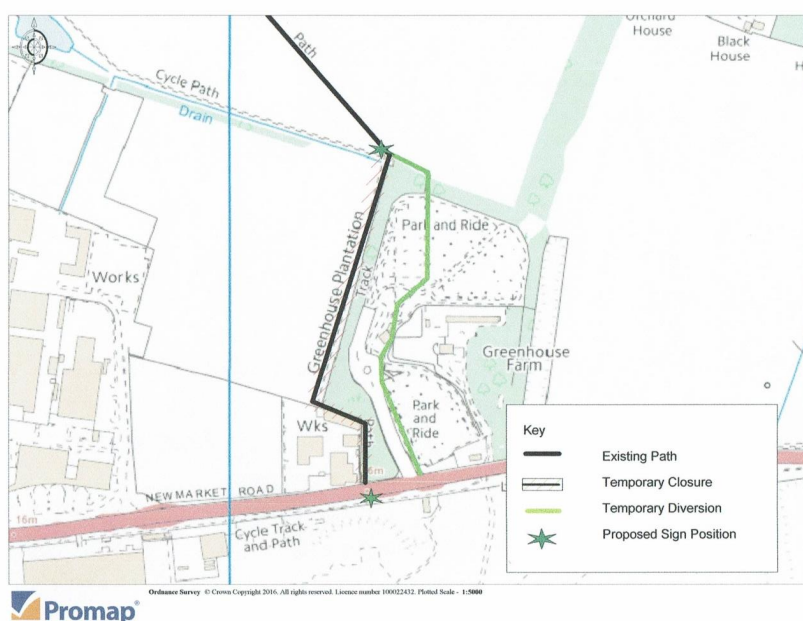

Lucy Frazer MP helps on broadband

Access to broadband is critical to Cambridgeshire businesses and residents. As I met parish councils over the summer, it was clear that there are some small villages which are not properly connected.

Some people have contacted me about poor broadband in Teversham. At a time when we are investing in superfast broadband and increasing connectivity, it is not acceptable that many people still have such issues. I want to correct this.

On Friday, 23rd October, I held an open meeting to bring together BT, Connecting Cambridgeshire and affected residents to resolve these problems and I wanted to update you on Connecting Cambridgeshire's and BT's position at that meeting.

Connecting Cambridgeshire are aware that some properties on the Foxgloves estate cannot access better broadband. If your property is on that estate and cannot receive superfast broadband (24Mbps+) from Virgin Media or BT please email contact@connectingcambridgeshire.co.uk with your full address and landline telephone number. It would also be helpful if you can encourage friends and neighbours on the estate who have this problem to also contact Connecting Cambridgeshire so they can build up a picture of the full extent of the problem.

Whilst I am very happy to assist with all queries, Connecting Cambridgeshire is very keen for those with problems to contact them directly. For specific broadband issues and information on the broadband programme, you can contact Connecting Cambridgeshire by emailing contact@connectingcambridgeshire.co.uk. For BT-specific issues, if you have already spoken with your service provider, you can call BT directly to try and resolve the issue.

I will continue to press Connecting Cambridgeshire and BT to deliver a service that we deserve.
